Services at GIL include transportation to classes, job opportunities, and community resources; organizing field trips to businesses, vocational centers, and colleges for career exposure; and hosting monthly mentoring gatherings. A gift of \$4,560 would support monthly bus passes, field trips and mentoring events for the year.
